## Zoning Board Meeting Minutes May 11, 2015

Mr. Williams explained that the Council would like the Zoning board to open up discussion for annexation. He then read a letter that the Town Attorney, Jeb Branham sent over about annexation. Mr. Bryan asked if we could send out letters to citizens to ask if they would volunteer to be annexed. Mr. Williams said that we could. The members then discussed how far the city limits extends on all sides. Mr. Larson recommended that we need to let the citizens know of the benefits of being annexed in to the City, and that they would also have to pay city tax. Mr. Williams explained all aspects of annexing properties. The members agreed to pick one area of the Town and try. We will send out letters or go door to door. The deciding vote was to go ½ mile in every direction for most potential. The board then discussed Chapter 195. We agreed that we need to put in a minimum square foot. Mr. Larson recommended no less than 1000 sq. 35% residential and 50% commercial (maximum building area) The board also discussed storage container homes, agricultural, and tree houses. Mr. Williams went over some areas of Chapter 195 and asked the board to go over the District area. Mr. Williams would like it to be completed and present it to the Council by the 1<sup>st</sup> meeting in August.
