- Resolution 2014-R10 Nassau County Girl Scouts
  - Three (3) Girl Scouts & their adult sponsor addressed the Council:
    - Thanked the Council for generous donation last year and said it went to meat for the Fire Stations of Nassau County & the remainder to make JSO Soldier bags for Christmas.
    - This is their 7<sup>th</sup> year of doing the baskets and bags.
    - Asked the Council to consider raising the amount from \$250 to \$500, so that they can do an additional amount of Soldier bags during another time of year when the soldiers are forgotten.
